Promoting Friendship

Thankfully, bullying is very rare in our small school. Building relationships is all part of learning and sometimes children make mistakes. We work hard to encourage the children of EVPA to form positive relationships with all members of our school community. This week the children have led assemblies on anti-bullying and promoting friendship. They have come up with two fantastic ideas:

- Celebrate a friend this is a box placed in reception where the children can fill in a slip explaining how that person has demonstrated positive friendship. Once a week the box will be emptied and the 'Good Friends' celebrated in assembly.
- Playground Friends a small number of children will be wearing friendship bands (a green coloured strap across their coat). These children will be available to support / play with children who may be feeling lonely or sad on the playground.

It makes me proud when the children make suggestions such as these as it shows what a caring and supportive group of young people choose to come to our school.
