Meet the Staff

Gemma Byard

We've all seen Gemma outside when we collect our children, available to talk about our children, offering us support and advice. But what does Gemma do all day? Let's get to know the staff at our school!

What time do you arrive at school?

I arrive at 8 am. I use the time before the children arrive to prepare the resources I need for the interventions that I have each day.

What is an intervention?

Some of our students require individual support or benefit from working in a smaller group. Each afternoon I have 4-5 interventions. During these sessions, we cover a variety of subjects depending on the children's needs.

Once the children arrive, how does your day progress?

During the first hour of the day, I am in the Reception class assisting some of The Squirrels with their Kinetic Letters. Afterwards, I move onto the Badgers. I assist Miss Miller by delivering lessons to small groups, preparing display boards, giving spelling tests or special attention to a child who might need it. Shortly before noon, I leave The Badgers class and work with the dinner staff to support them.

How long have you been working at Ecton Village Primary Academy?

I began as a volunteer when my son, Austin started Reception. Four years ago, I completed my training as a Level 2 Teachers Assistant.

What other qualifications do you have?

I'm Kinetic Letter trained, SLCN (Speech and Language Communication Needs), Level 3 First Aider, Safeguarding trained as well as being the SEN TA (Special Education Needs Teaching Assistant).

What is the greatest challenge in your day?

There are so many possibilities to support the children, but unfortunately not enough time.

What is most rewarding about your job?

When you see a child have a breakthrough, it's remarkable. It's a joy to witness this daily (Gemma is smiling ear to ear as she answers this question).

We hope you've enjoyed reading about Gemma and her work. We will continue interviewing the staff which will be published in the next newsletters.
