Why is homework important?

Homework will help your child to:

- Learn how to organise and manage their time
- Take more responsibility for their own learning
- Practise and build on what they have learned at school
- Develop confidence to deal with frustrations, overcome difficulties and solve problems
- Learn and work independently for the future
- Share their learning with you

Did you know?

Between the ages of 5 and 16, children spend only 15% of their lives in school so supporting them at home really improves their chances of success.

Did you know?

Children who do homework regularly throughout their time at school benefit from the equivalent of roughly an extra year's schooling.

Did you know?

Children learn something well when they talk about it or explain it to someone else.

How can you help?

- Help your child find a quiet place to work
- Make time to be involved with your child's homework
- Offer interest and support
- Hear them read, and write it in their reading log
- Help them learn their spellings and times tables.

Parental Controls
