# School Improvements

## Redecoration

With the help of Hatton Academies Trust, the half term holiday saw even more improvements being made to our school. The internal redecoration of the main building has been completed and the children's toilets have been refurbished. Many of you have commented on the new carpet in the front reception area and we all agree that it has given this area a much needed spruce up!



## Playground

The money raised by the former PTA and through the summer fete has been put to good use - the playground wall has now been re-rendered and we still have some money left to decorate the wall. Exactly what it will look like is up to the school council!

More of your generously donated money has been used to support the refurbishment and extension of the trim trail and the new monkey bars are proving to be VERY popular at play time!

## Breakfast Club

Having secured a grant from the National Lottery fund to set up a Breakfast Club, we have now had kitchen units installed to create a kitchen area in the hall to get us fully up and running! Breakfast Club is open from 8am every day and the sessions are supervised by Gemma and Miss Miley. The children enjoy a healthy breakfast and have access to a number of games and craft activities - they may even do their homework!



## Outdoor Classroom

As well as the kitchen area, the lottery fund has enabled us to install a fantastic outdoor classroom. This space has been fitted with benches and a blackboard and is a wonderfully versatile building. As well as being used by the breakfast club, as the weather gets better we will use it for phonics, reading and many other outdoor learning activities. The children can use this area at playtime and it has given us a super area for those children who prefer quieter activities.





## Packed Lunch Inspiration

Thinking of healthy and exciting pack lunch fillings can be a daily challenge. Especially if you can't envisage your child happily trotting off to school with a box of sprouting mung beans, and you're not bowing to the crisp and chocolate demands. Here is a simple, fast and scrumptious idea to bring new life to the dreaded lunchbox, and remember, the power of novelty is not to be underestimated.

### Ham 'Sushi'

1 slice granary bread, crusts removed

1 tbsp soft cheese

1 slice wafer-thin ham

1 thin cucumber stick, trimmed to length of bread

Fussy eaters will love this fun twist on a sandwich and these ham 'sushi' make perfect lunchbox snacks. Instead of ham and cucumber, why not try cheese and celery?



Flatten the bread slightly with a rolling pin. Spread one side with the soft cheese and top with the ham, keeping the slice as fat as possible.

Put the cucumber stick at one end of the bread. Gently roll up the bread around the cucumber, securing it with a little extra soft cheese. (If making the night before, chill the roll until needed.)

Cut the roll into four pieces to make 'sushi' rounds and pop in a lunchbox.

### Our Morning Routine

### Term Time Holidays

Please can we reiterate that term time holidays will NEVER be authorised. It is not acceptable to take your child out of school for a family holiday, or for a family trip / birthday treat. Please understand that any unauthorised absence of 5 days or more may be referred to the Local Education Authority (LEA) and that ANY holiday (even one or two days) will also be referred to the LEA. The LEA may then impose a fine. The LEA can fine parents £60 for taking their child on holiday without permission. The fine is per child, per absence and each parent can be fined.
