

## Ecton Village Primary Academy Vision Statement for Primary PE and Sport Premium 2020-2021

All pupils leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

## **Objective**

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and Sport at Ecton Village Primary Academy. To include:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity thus kick starting healthy active lifestyles
- the profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all new staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and outdoor activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport both in and beyond school

Continue to develop skills, knowledge and understanding of pupils through high quality PE lessons, extra-curricular clubs, leadership opportunities and local competitions.

Continue to enhance the quality of physical activity at play time and lunch time.

Make physical activity part of daily life at EVPA and children understand the benefits of physical and mental health.

Improvements to the underused outdoor areas in order to enhance. outdoor learning in terms 5/6. Activities will include creating a wildlife garden.

- 1. All pupils to engage in two hours of PE per week. The PE curriculum has been revised to 3. be in line with the whole school curriculum and includes inspiration British sportsmen and women. Children to learn from British elite athletes as part of the PE lessons.
- 2. Staff changes means that newer staff need additional training. SSco to work with staff to develop sustainable skills in teaching PE
- 3. SSco to work with children on developing physical skills and 'sportsmanship'.
- 4. Young Leaders to be trained to deliver PE lessons and activities 6. – at break and lunch times.
- 5. Repair areas of the trim trail in order to ensure that the equipment is safe and able to be used by all children.
- 6. All staff and children in KS2 to begin the day with running or

- 1. Timetables will show the time allocated to PE lessons and every child will be involved in these weekly sessions. Teacher tracking will show levels of progress. LTPs show links to the revised whole school curriculum and children will be able to tell vou about elite athletes they have learned about.
- 2. OU will work alongside MH (SSco) in delivering KS2 PE
- 3. MH will support the delivery of PE lessons and support teaching the physical skills and the skills and attributes of 'sportsmanship'
- 4. Young Leaders will be trained by MH (SSCo) and be given the opportunity to run PE and lunch games sessions. Pupils' planning and photographs of the sessions will be evidence.
